

Consumed by Sin Romans 3:23

Humanity is fallen (Romans 3:23). We are born sinners. We are trapped within the bondage of sin; however, we do not realize that sin consumes our lives. We think it is how things are supposed to be. 



UABC collected these items in April for the Ukraine ministry project: baby and toddler clothes, baby blankets, diapers, pacifiers and a \$50 offering for food. Our Holston Baptist Association collaborated with God's Warehouse in the Nolichucky Baptist Association in Morristown. On May 2, a 40- foot container was shipped to Moldova. The second container was shipped on May 16th. "We picked up items that Tennessee Baptists collected from Memphis to Mountain City and Chattanooga to the Kentucky state line," said Don Owen, who oversees the ministry of God's Warehouse which also includes volunteers

from other associations in East TN.
